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BUCOLIC OAK TERRACE

One of the most distinguishing features of our neighborhood are the very large old trees. The majority of the largest trees are made up of native oaks, hickories, and walnuts. As a result of lawn mowing, saplings from existing trees are not allowed to grow. We are encouraging all homeowner to plant at least one tree from the above mentions species types to help maintain the look and feel of our neighborhood for generations to come.

There will be a controlled burn at **Hansen Park** and the **Rain Garden** this year—as per our upkeep agreement for the funds which were donated for the original work—which will cost approx. \$1200. The problem with invasive plant life in the lake was discussed at the April meeting and OT will be cooperating with the Mundelein Park District and West Shore Park in eliminating/keeping it under control. Both these tasks will need to be implemented on an intermittent basis. Also, boulders will be placed in front of the seawall at Beach Park to stop the back-lash from waves and the consequent erosion. Boat owners please be aware of wave damage to piers and frontage and observe a reasonable nowake area.

ATTENTION: KAYAKERS & PADDLE BOARDERS

In the past few years, there have been tragic examples of small boats, notably kayaks, run down by larger, fast-moving boats. Source: **Seaworthy, the Boat U.S. Marine Insurance and Damage Avoidance Report,**" **July 2012, p. 4.** Based on a series of tests on the water using volunteers in kayaks and powerboats, among their recommendations to kayakers were:

1) Carry an audible signaling device. 2) Wear fluorescent life vests or shirts. 3) Use paddles with white or light colored blades. 4) Avoid kayaking in areas with high boat traffic. 5) Use flags that can be mounted on kayaks.

Conversely, owners of larger boats are advised to: wear sunglasses; keep a proper lookout; and, be especially alert in areas where you are likely to encounter smaller craft.
