Mundelein Park District and Mundelein Police Department are teaming up to host National Night Out at Community Park and Barefoot Bay. They are having a superhero themed night and kids can join the fun by dressing as their favorite superhero.

From 6:00 - 10:00 PM on August 6th, residents in neighborhoods throughout Mundelein and across the nation, are asked to lock their doors, turn on outside lights and spend the evening outside with neighbors and police.

All Mundelein residents are cordially invited to participate. This remarkable community program is designed to bring neighbors together, strengthen neighborhood spirit, and generate participation in anti-crime and drug programs. NNO sends a message to criminals that we are fighting back against crime as a community.

Mosquitos Test Positive for West Nile Virus in Lake County

A Mosquito pool sampled June 13th in Highland Park has tested positive for West Nile Virus and it is the first confirmed indicator of West Nile presence in Lake County in 2019. Practice the four D's to protect yourself from Mosquitos:

Drain - Drain standing water from items around your home and yard

Defend - Use Insect repellant when outdoors that includes DEET, picaridin or IR 3535

Dawn and Dusk - Protect yourself from morning to night, especially during prime times for Mosquito activity (early morning and night) **Dress -** Wear long sleeves, pants and closed toe shoes when outside to cover your skin
