The Board would also like to thank the following speakers who were present at the meeting:

Fireman Tony Rodkey shared information about open burning. Briefly, keep burning to daylight hours in a 5-15mph wind speed. No street burning at any time. Please visit <u>countrysidefire.com</u> for additional information. New flyers with updated changes have been placed on the Oak Terrace Message boards.

Lake County Supervisor Diane O'Kelly spoke about the fantastic voter turnout at her location on Election day. 4300 Voters passed through the doors and it all went smoothly. She also spoke about the referendum to use a single waste hauler. The referendum passed at 61% and will go out to bid in early 2019. Highway Commissioner Bill Grinnell talked about getting ready for the snow. He stated that the EPA has cracked down on Salt usage on the roads. He spoke about using a new product this year, transitioning from Salt to a liquid <Beet Juice> as a more environmentally friendlier product. Beet juice is becoming a very popular snow and ice fighting tool. It is organic, reduces corrosion, melts to very low temperatures and reduces the amount of material needed for application.The mixture helps rock salt melt ice below its 15-degree limit and helps municipalities melt larger amounts of ice and clean up snow more quickly. It is also sticky, preventing salt rocks from bouncing off of the road as cars drive past. For more information visit highway@fremonttownship.com

Tori Tratscht spoke about the Diamond Lake Cooperative Preservation strategy (Please see last months Acorn Newsletter) regarding the Grant, specifically the Stewardship guide she is preparing for an early 2019 release. She noted ways to take care of our Lake, Fertilize less, Salt less, remove leaves from the street to prevent going into drains. She mentioned that the lake is now 23.6 feet as opposed to 25 feet in 1997. Also, our watershed area is larger then previously thought and runs down towards and into Diamond lake. Rain Gardens help with runoff and will be highlighted in an early 2019 Acorn Newsletter about where and how to plant them. Treasurer report

OTIA Treasurer William Yarbrough gave the 2018 Budget overview (mailed out along with the Ballots in October). Notably the association dues will stay at \$170 for 2019. He spoke about Delinquent dues and the process the Board takes to pursue moneys owed. Currently there are 33 delinquent accounts, 17 owe \$500+ and 6 account for \$17,000, a small amount of accounts in arrears were reconciled. If necessary, please contact William to make payment arrangements.
