HOA Dues Overview

As mentioned in last months Acorn, there are currently 33 delinquent accounts or 18% of OT properties. Of these delinquencies, 17 owe \$500+ and 6 account for \$17,000. The OTIA Pursued delinquent accounts by mail with a November 7th deadline for payment., these will now be handed over for legal review and ultimately Collections. *Notably, our Dues for 2019 will be staying the same at \$170*.

HOA fees: What are they and how do they benefit our community?

A homeowners association fee (HOA fee) is an amount of money that must be paid by the owners of residential properties, and HOAs collect these fees to assist with maintaining and improving properties in the association.

For Oak Terrace residents, this includes the continuous upkeep and maintenance of our beautiful Beach, Parks (and neighborhood as a whole). Even if you do not use these common areas, their presence adds to the uniqueness and community that is Oak Terrace.

Even though there are only a small number of delinquent accounts, I listed a few of the research-based reasons why HOAs are good for you and your neighborhood and to remind us of how fortunate we are to have a hard working OTIA that put our dues to great use.

THEY PROVIDE RECREATIONAL AMENITIES. People living in HOA communities tend to have easier access to recreational amenities. Here in OT, that is our Beach and two Parks (Hansen and Lakeview)

THOSE AMENITIES ARE WELL-MAINTAINED. Our OTIA has a sub Committee where members are assigned to the upkeep and maintenance of the OT Beach, Parks and their restoration among other duties

YOU SHARE OWNERSHIP OF THE COMMUNITY. Because homeowners in HOAs pay into an association, it means that all members share ownership of the community's common areas and facilities (OT Parks and Beach).

YOU FEEL A STRONGER SENSE OF COMMUNITY. With everyone owning an equal share of public spaces within the community and everyone doing their part to keep it looking great, HOAs can provide a stronger sense of community than many non-HOA neighborhoods. Some HOAs even host events in their community spaces, a great way to make new friends. Here in OT we have an Easter Parade, Spring clean up day, Summer fest, Turkey Trot and coming soon a Snowman Build off!

YOU HAVE MORE CONTROL OVER RESTRICTIONS. With an HOA, all of the rules are composed by and designed for the homeowners. They are elected by you and your neighbors, our Oak Terrace Community. This method of collective management gives you more influence over your community. Oak Terrace holds monthly Board meetings (1st Wednesday of the month) where you are strongly encouraged to attend to share your thoughts and ideas.
