# Time to Tidy Up! Mundelein's Spring Clean-Up Dates Announced

I was originally going to write here about Mundelein's Spring clean up but was informed last minute by a neighbor that this does not apply to Oak Terrace as we are unincorporated. So instead, here is an excerpt from the fantastic Stewardship guide that was recently prepared by Tori Trauscht.

'During most of the past 1.6 million years, nearly all of the northern hemisphere was covered with glacial ice. As the ice periodically melted, it deposited buried soils. The Illinois Episode of deposition was from 300,000 to 150,000 years ago. Roughly 14,000 years ago, the glacier retreated and carved various lakes into the landscape. One of these was Diamond lake, which is which is why it's called a glacial lake'.
