Downed tree in Lakeview park

You may have noticed that the Willow tree was damaged in a storm at the shoreline of Lakeview park back in July. The association is aware of this and options of how to move forward were discussed at the August 7th Board meeting. It was decided to remove all of the larger branches and debris away from the area but to keep the remainder of the tree where it is to become a 'natural breakwater' in the lake. The tree is right along the shoreline so removal could be detrimental to this area. Two bids were sought for the project and Sawvell have been chosen. They will use a small, rubber dozer to carry away the tree sections, causing no damage to the grass area. If this 'natural break water' method does not prove to be successful, the board will look into other options.



Adopt a highway project

Kevin Shifley reported back to the board at the August meeting that the stretch of highway we are interested in adopting (route 60/83 between Oak shores drive and Maple) is currently not available. It was suggested we consider adopting Diamond lake road along Hansen park as an alternative. If we are able to adopt one of theses areas, it would be Oak Terrace's obligation to do an organized clean-up twice a year and a sign would be installed letting others know that OTIA is responsible for those sections. As we already have an annual 'Spring clean up' event, adding an additional one later in the year should not pose a problem.

Car thefts in Oak Terrace

Unfortunately a number of cars on Elmwood and Hickory Avenue (maybe additional streets) in Oak Terrace were broken into last month (night/early morning of August 12th/13th). Most of the cars were unlocked and only had cash or small items taken. The Police were called and a report was made. Fortunately, a couple of Elmwood residents had camera footage and were able to provide this to the Police department. Please be vigilant and bear in mind the following when parking your car on the street or in your driveway.

- Always secure your vehicle close all windows and lock the doors
- Don't keep valuable belongings in the car or on display
- Install a security system or advertise the one you have to deter future incidents


Grandparents day
